Rail

Travelling in London

We strongly advise that you use public transport (rail, air, underground, bus, taxi) when travelling to and around London. For up to date information about London transport see website www.tfl.gov.uk

Underground – Once you get into London, the Underground or Tube provides an easy, comprehensive and quick way to travel around the capital. It is divided up into zones; the centre being zone 1 and the outer edge being zone 6. The nearest tube station to the venue is ANGEL on the Northern Line. It is on the border of zones 1 and 2. Up to date fares can be calculated on website www.tube.tfl.gov.uk using the route finder.

Taxis – There are taxi ranks outside all main London train stations. For estimated costs, see website www.tfl.gov.uk/pco You can either use a taxi direct from a designated rank, hail one in the street, or book one in advance by credit card (make sure you ask about any additional charges)
